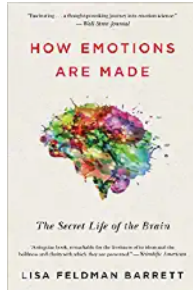


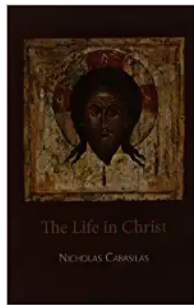
Becoming Eucharist: A Reading List with Fr. Billy Daniel

The Life in Christ, Nicholas Cabasilas



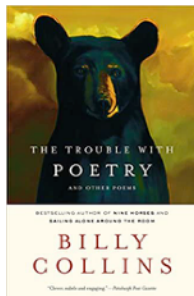
A 14th Century writing and theologian about the baptismal life. Like all ancient writings, this requires a little more effort, so to adapt to the author's form of writing and unique perspective.

The Man Who Was Thursday, G. K. Chesterton



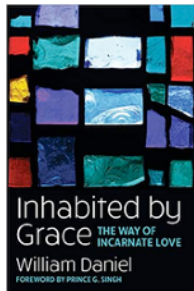
A novella by one of England's greatest author's and Christian thinkers, which deals with the cosmic relation of good and evil, light and darkness, with typical British humor.

The Trouble with Poetry, Billy Collins



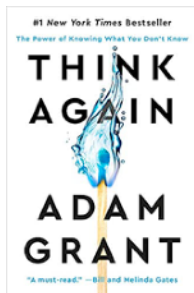
A collection of poetry that's helps the reader see the world from a different angle. Billy Collins' poetry never disappoints. He's sort of a poet for everyone.

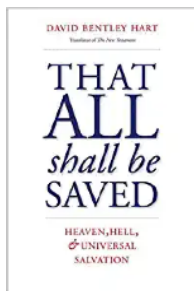

Think Again, Adam Grant



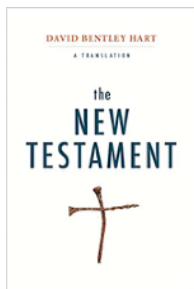
A new book on how we think and get stuck in certain patterns of thought and how to move beyond these. Adam Grant is very accessible and engaging.

That All Shall Be Saved, David Bentley Hart



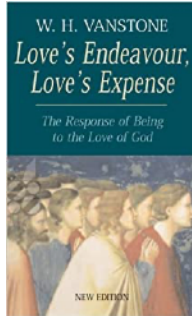
The best writing out there on universal salvation.

The New Testament, David Bentley Hart



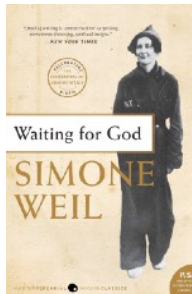
Hart's translation of the New Testament. An engaging and spiritually deepening translation that will transform how you read the Bible.

Love's Endeavor, Love's Expense, W. H. Vanstone



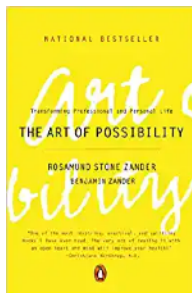
